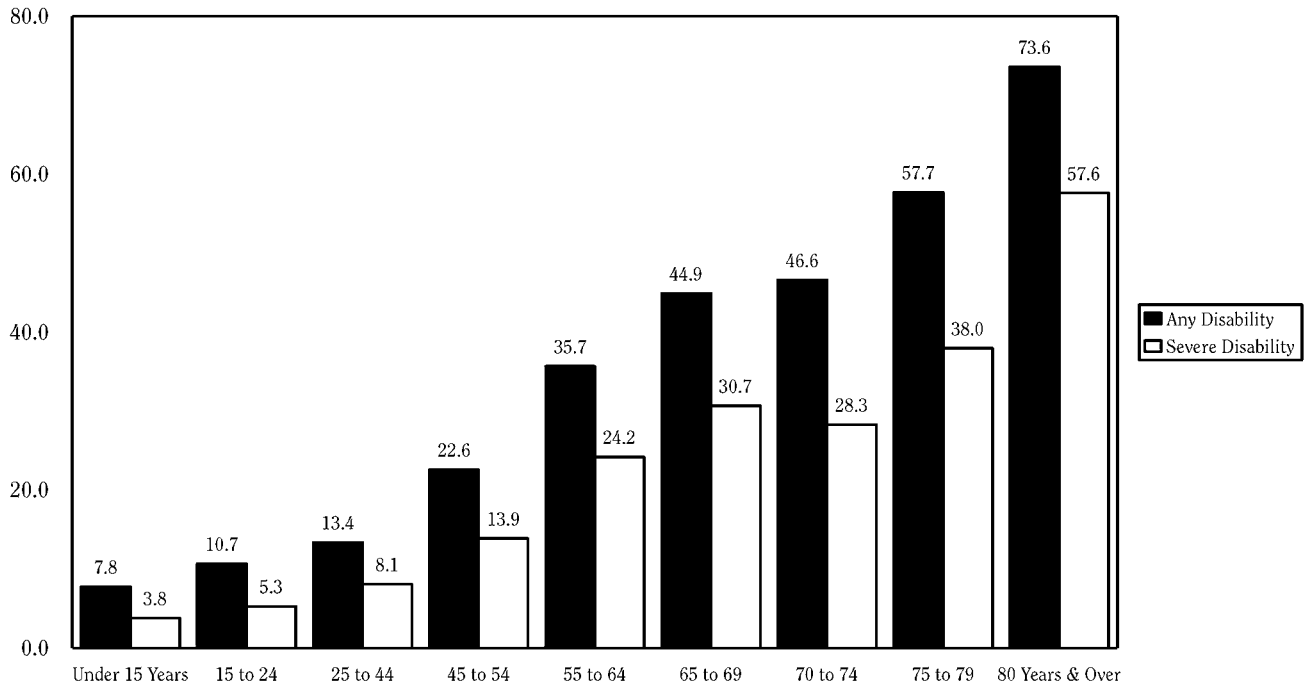

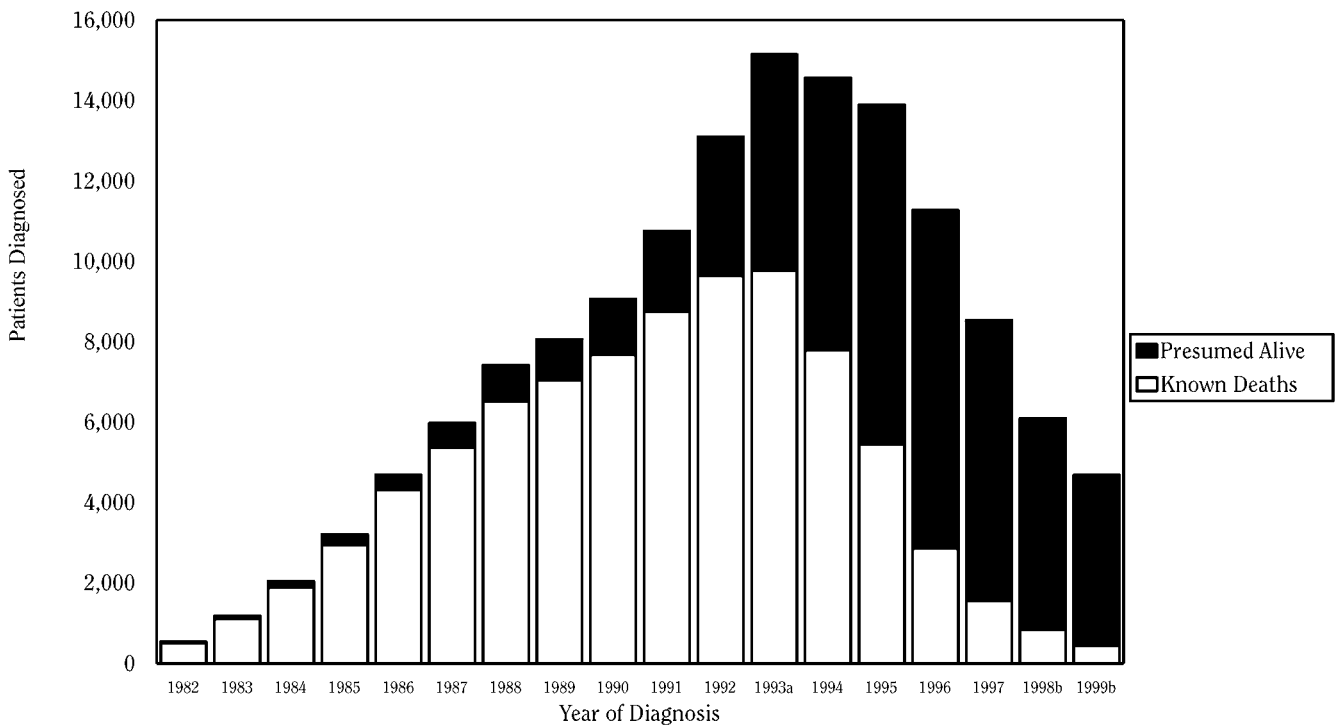

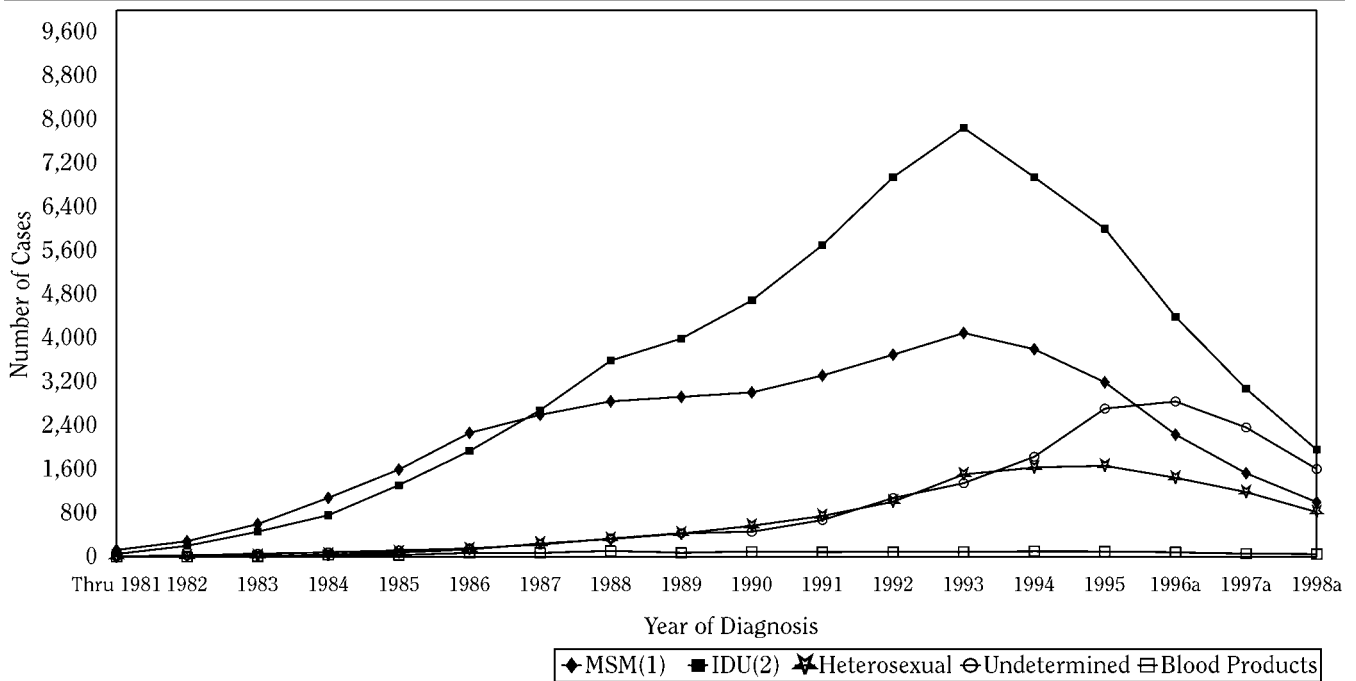

New York State — As of August 31, 1999



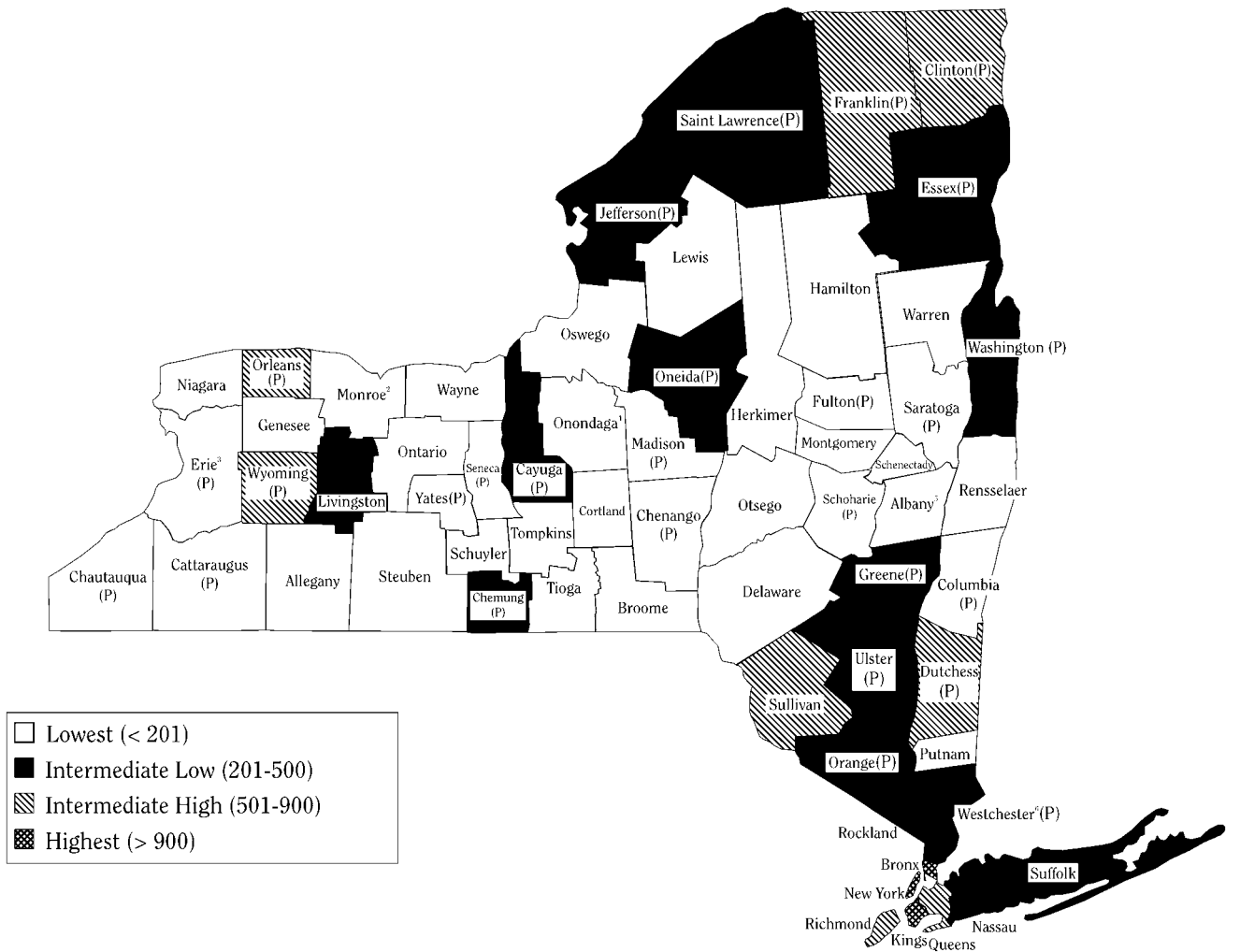
