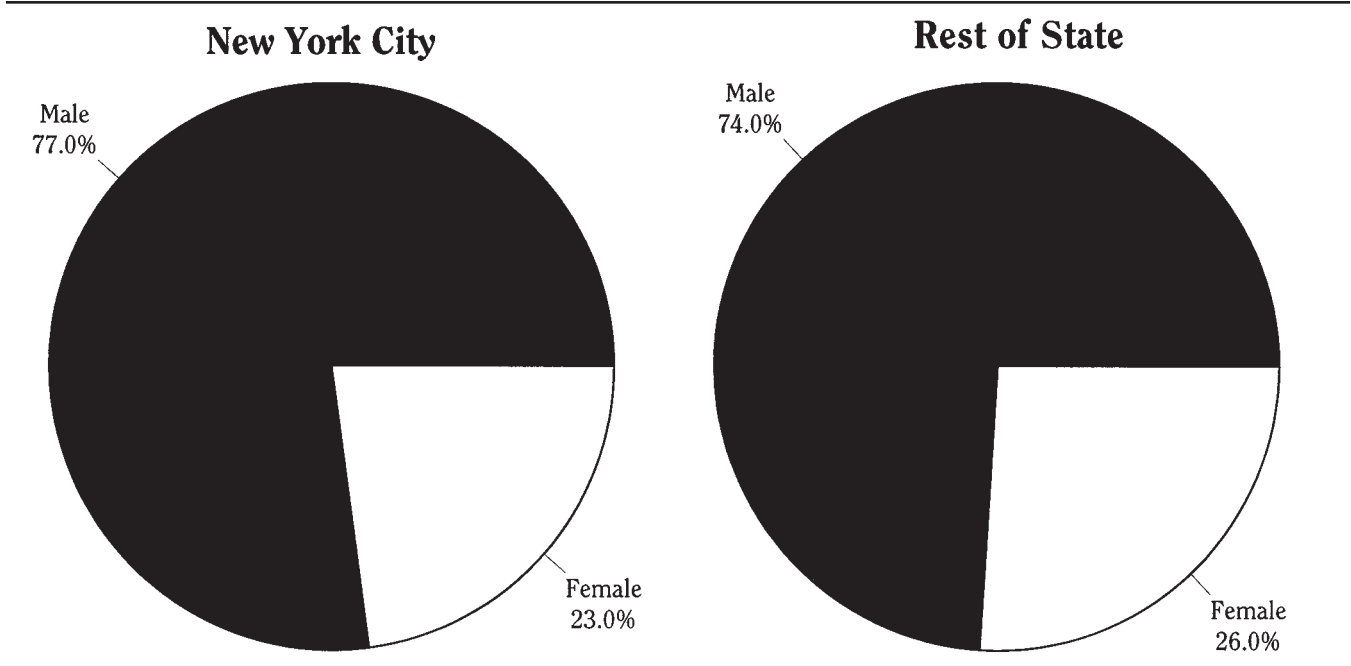

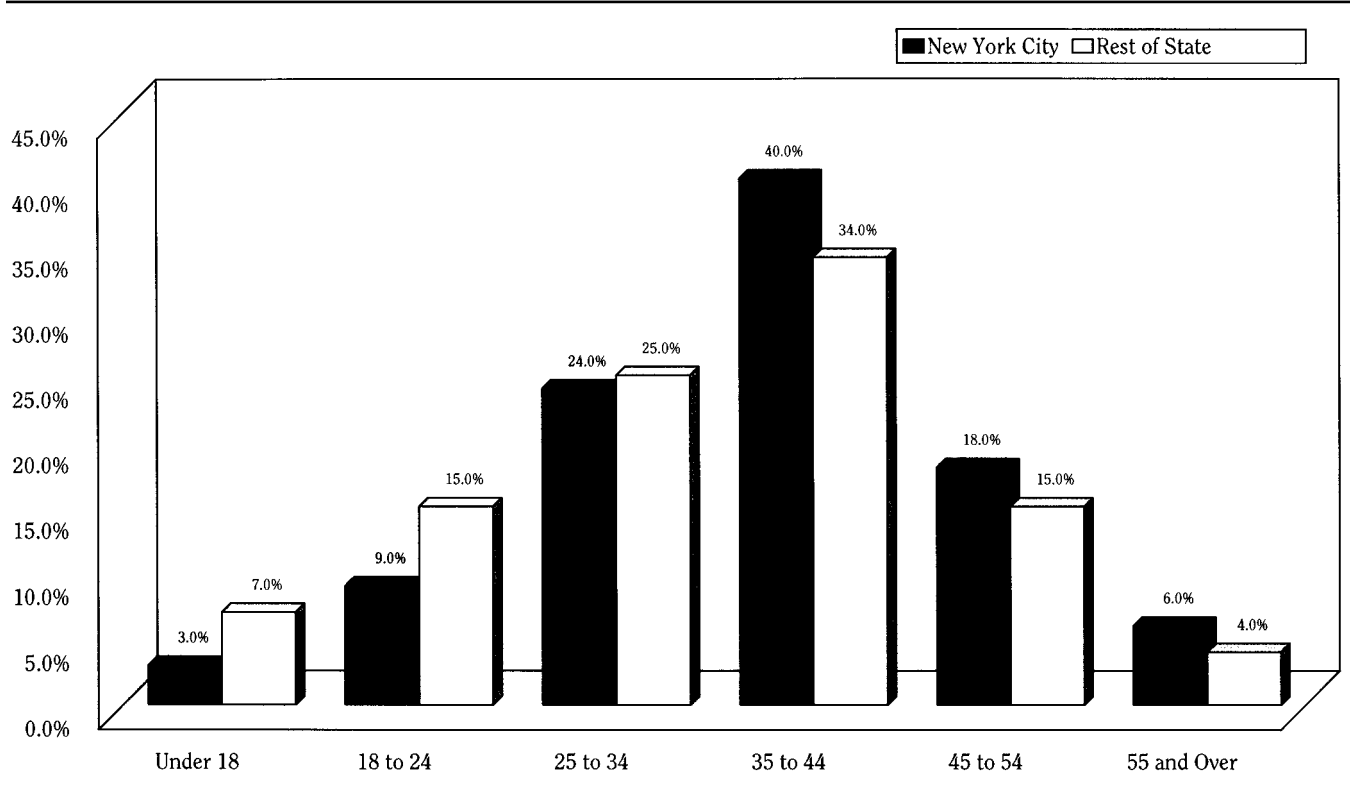

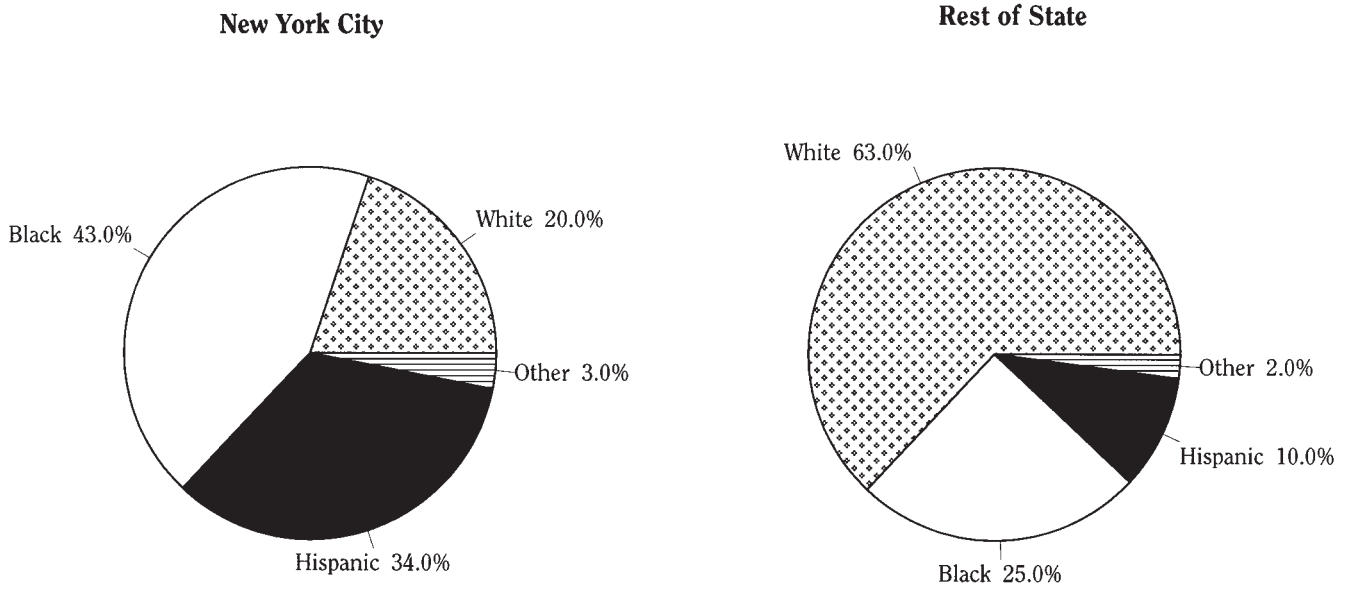

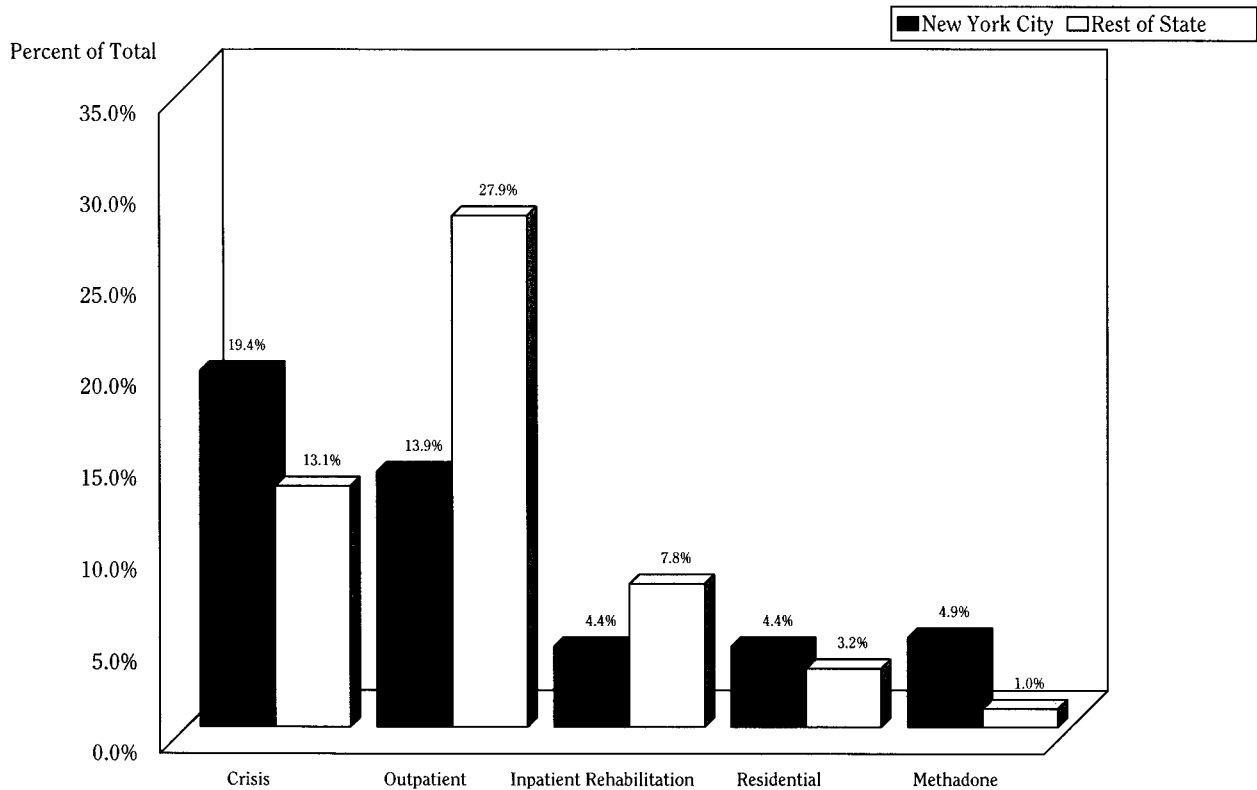
**Admission to Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Treatment
