



## Section H

# Public Safety and the Criminal Justice System

*Information on public safety in New York State — including police; crime rates; courts; prisons; children and family services; discrimination; and fire fighting.*

### Highlights

- There were over 56,000 full-time uniformed police in New York State in 2002.
- The crime rate in New York State was 2,931.6 per 100,000 population in 2001. This includes rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, and motor vehicle theft.
- There were over 4.2 million filings in New York State trial courts in 2002.
- There were over 65,000 inmates in state correctional facilities in November 2003.
- There were 2,359 youths admitted to Office of Children and Family Services programs in 2002.
- There were 7,917 discrimination complaints filed in New York State in fiscal year 2002-2003.
- There were about 713,000 fire department calls in New York in 2001, including rescue/EMS and false alarms.
