# Health and Human Services

*Information on health and related topics in New York State — including hospitals; psychiatric centers; substance abuse treatment; Social Security; Medicaid; temporary and family assistance; Food stamps; and foster care.*

### Highlights

- There were almost 2.5 million patients discharged from hospitals in New York State in 2001.
- About 7,600 New Yorkers were admitted to state psychiatric centers in fiscal year 2002-2003.
- Over 300,000 people were admitted to substance abuse treatment in New York in 2002.
- Over 625,000 New Yorkers received about \$3.5 billion in Supplemental Security Income in 2002.
- There were over 2.4 million Medicaid beneficiaries in New York in 2002.
- Over 1.3 million New Yorkers received over \$1.5 billion in Food Stamps benefits in 2002.
- There were over 37,000 children in foster care in New York State on December 31, 2002.

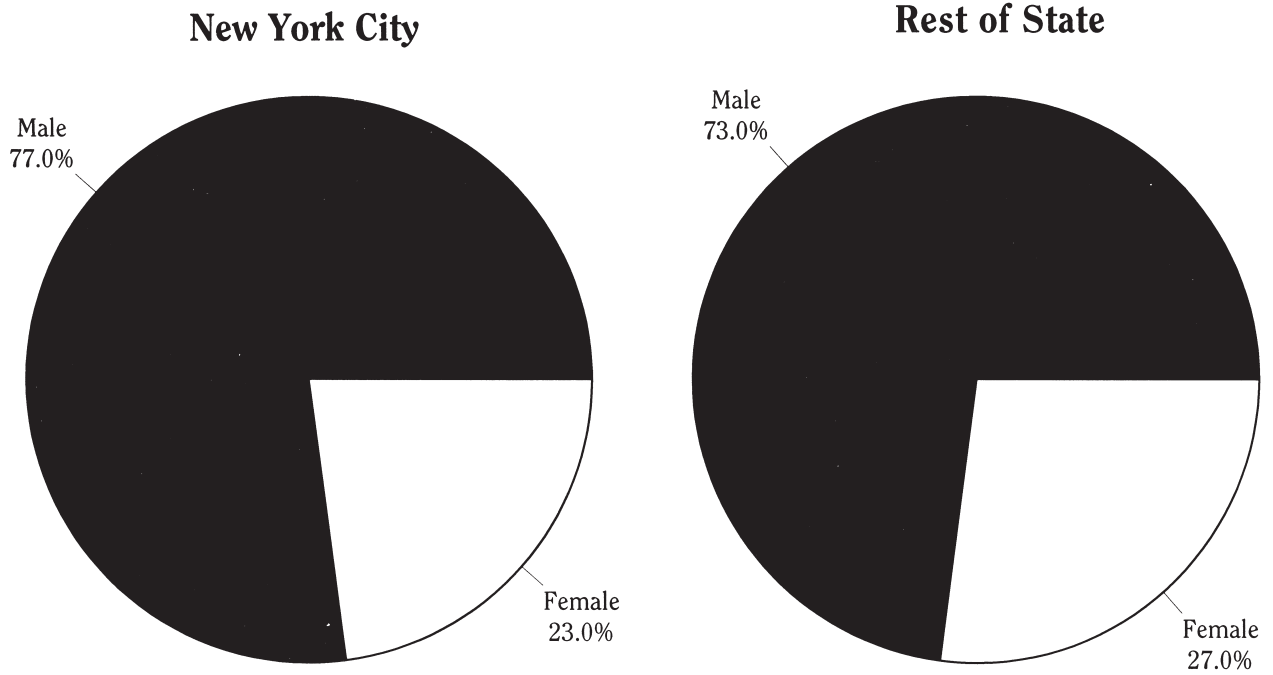

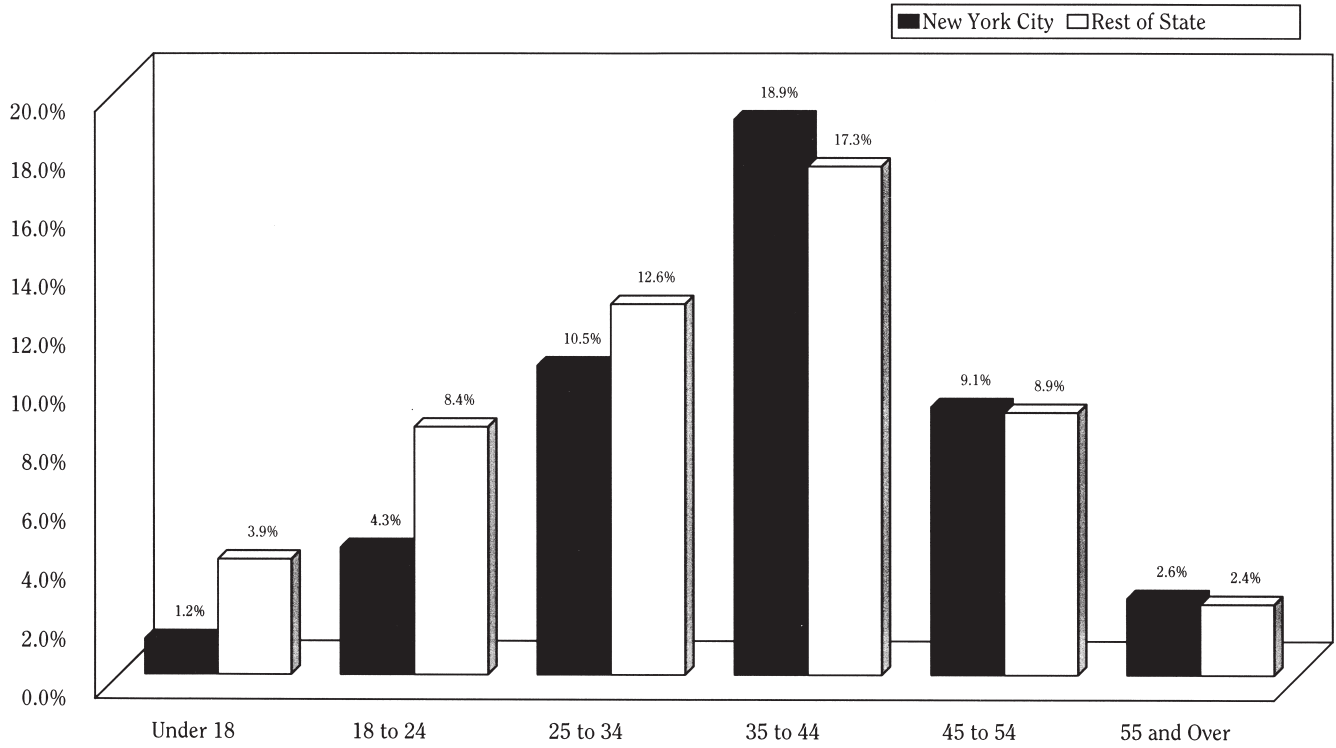

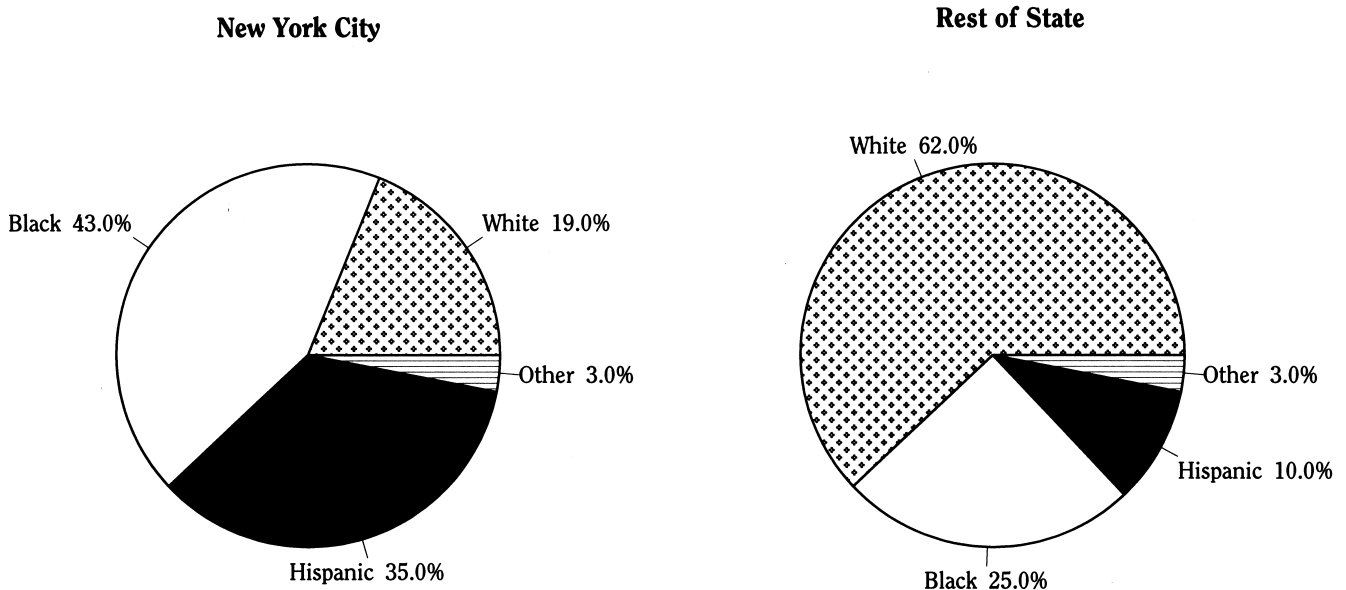
**Admission to Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Treatment

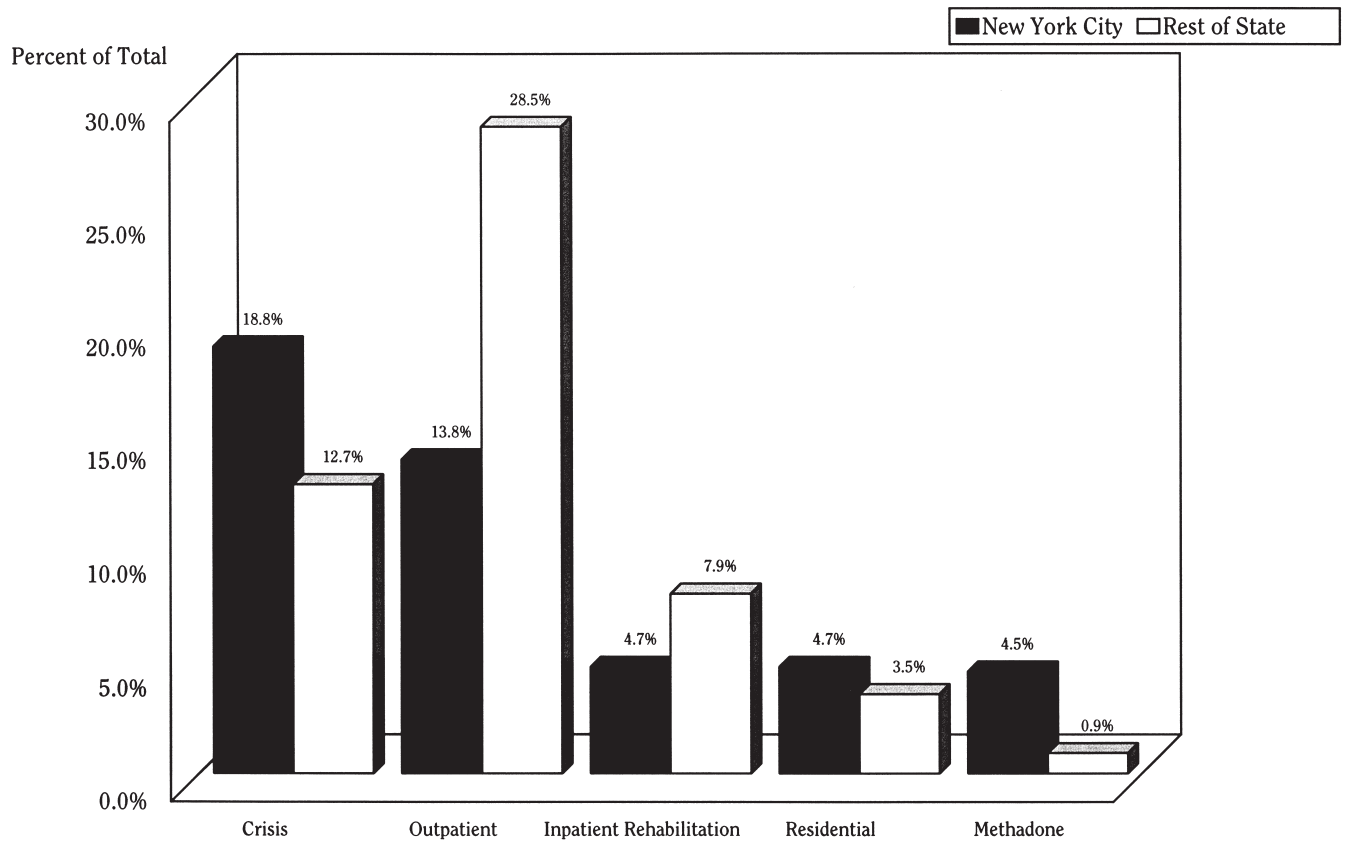
