



Section H

Public Safety and the Criminal Justice System

Information on public safety in New York State — including police; crime rates; courts; prisons; children and family services; discrimination; and fire fighting.

Highlights

- There were approximately 55 thousand full-time uniformed police in New York State in 2003. Almost 70 percent were employed by the New York City Police Department.
- The crime rate in New York State was 2,807.7 per 100 thousand population in 2002. This includes murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, and motor vehicle theft.
- There were approximately 4.3 million filings in New York State trial courts in 2003.
- There were over 65 thousand inmates in state correctional facilities in November 2003. Over 95 percent of the inmates were men.
- There were 7,917 discrimination complaints filed in New York State in fiscal year 2002-03. Over 86 percent of these complaints were employment related.
- There were over 1 million fire department calls in New York State in 2003, including fires, rescue/EMS and false alarms; about 75 thousand of these calls were for fires.
