Information on health and related topics in New York State — including hospitals; psychiatric centers; substance abuse treatment; Social Security; Medicaid; temporary and family assistance; Food Stamps; and foster care.

Highlights

- Approximately 2.5 million patients were discharged from hospitals in New York State in 2005.
- Approximately 7,000 New Yorkers were admitted to state psychiatric centers in fiscal year 2005-06.
- Almost 300,000 people were admitted to chemical dependency treatment in New York in 2005. Approximately 32 percent were 35 to 44 years of age.
- Over 630,000 New Yorkers received over \$3.7 billion in Supplemental Security Income in 2005.
- The average monthly Medicaid beneficiaries in New York increased by approximately 61,000 from 2004 to 2005. Sixty-eight percent of the recipients live in New York City.
- Approximately 1.7 million New Yorkers received almost \$2.2 billion in Food Stamp benefits in 2005.
- Approximately 27,000 children were in foster care in New York State on December 31, 2005, down almost 10 percent from approximately 30,000 when compared to December 31, 2004.

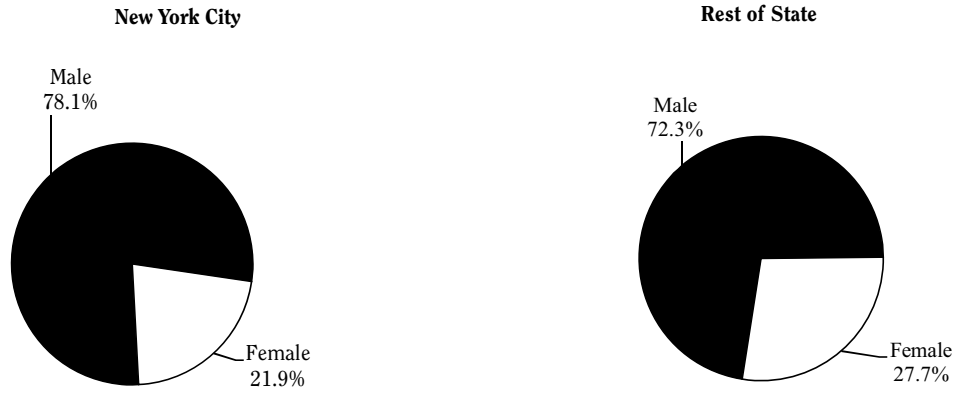

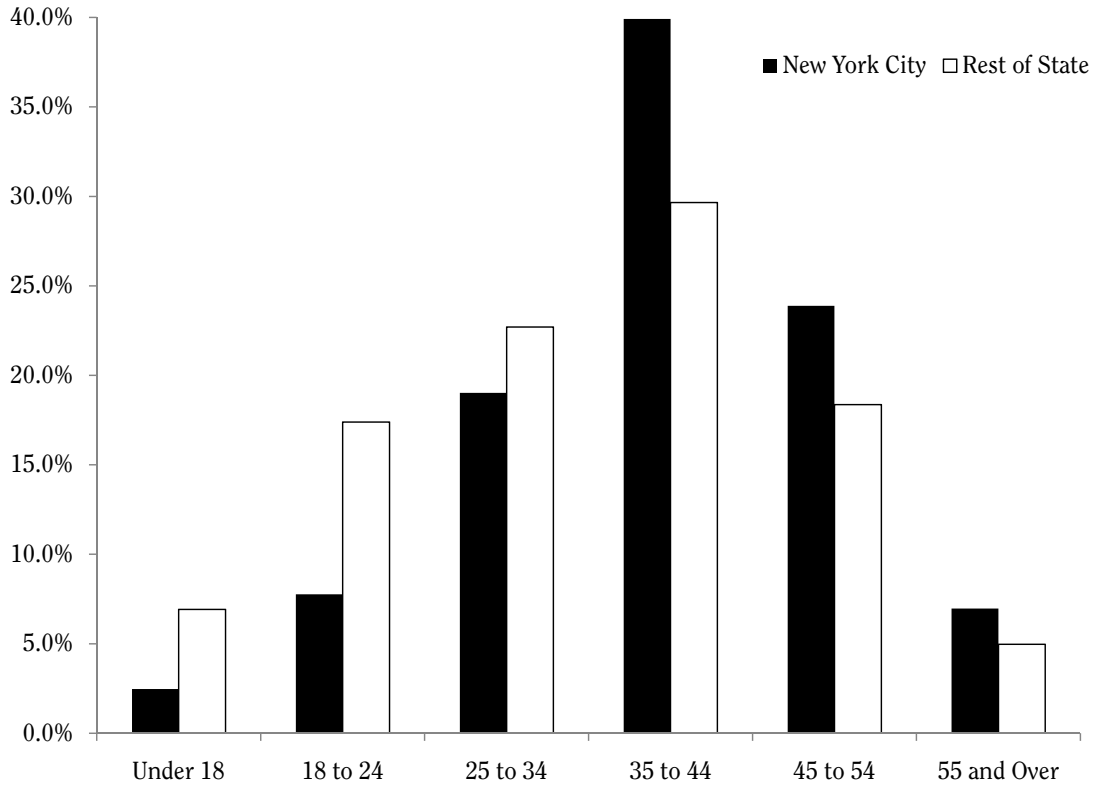

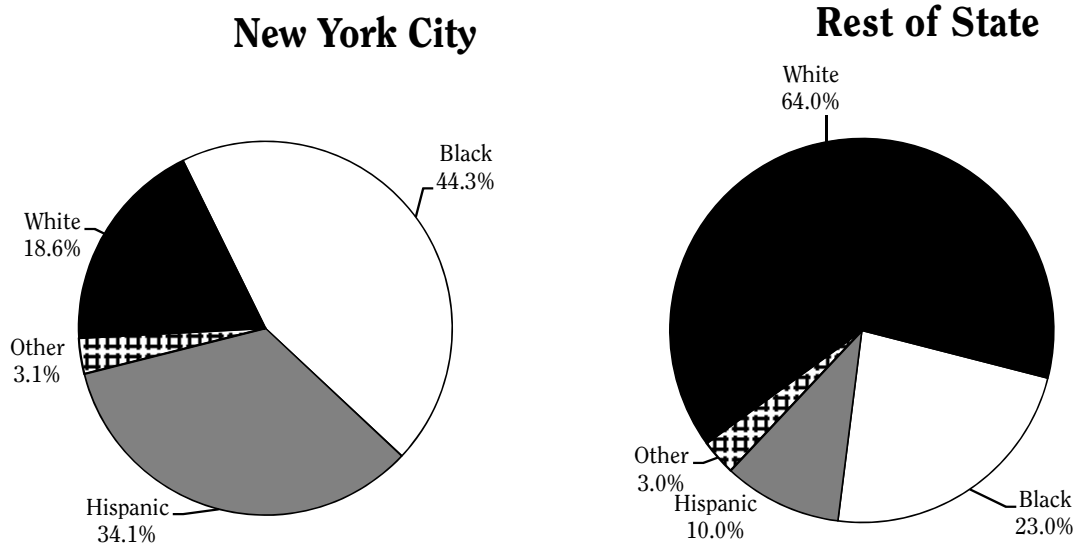

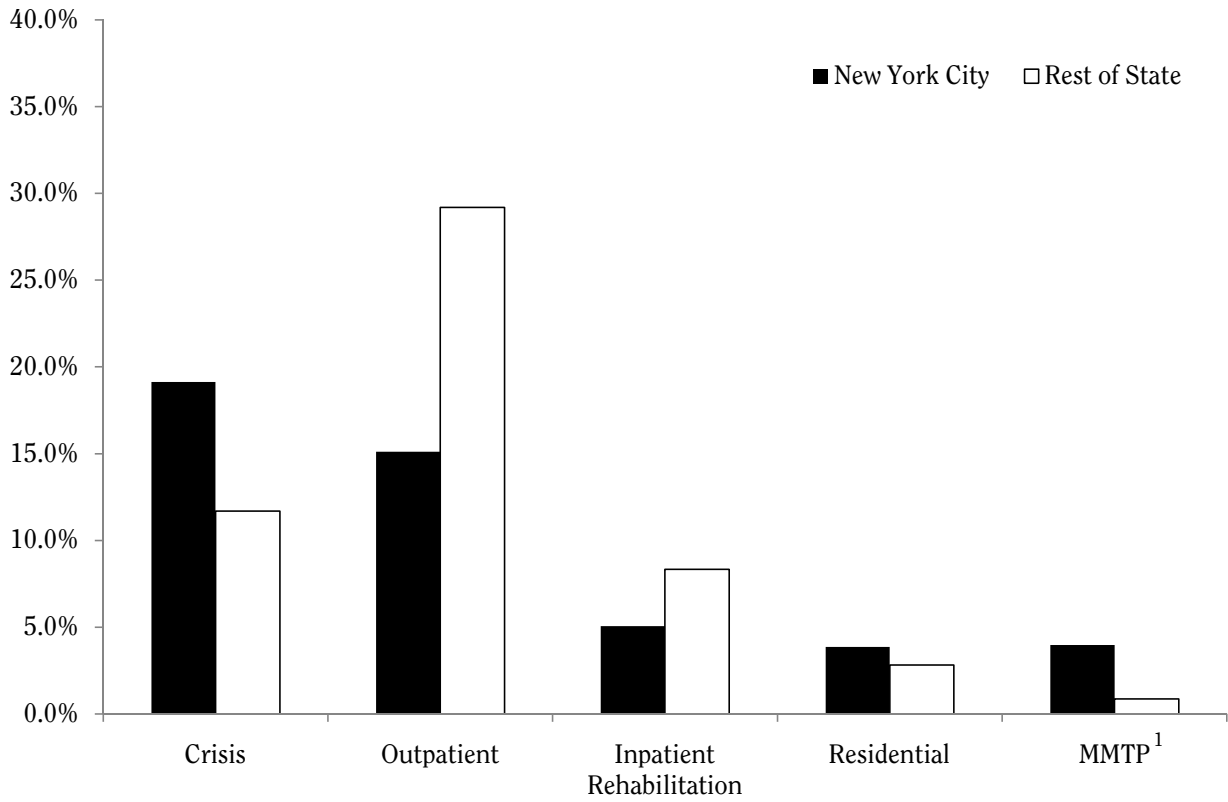
