



Section H

Public Safety and the Criminal Justice System

Information on public safety in New York State — including police; crime rates; courts; prisons; children and family services; discrimination; and fire fighting.

Highlights

- There were 53,700 full-time uniformed police in New York State in 2007. Sixty-seven percent were employed by the New York City Police Department.
- The crime rate in New York State was 2,379.6 per 100,000 population in 2007. This includes murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, and motor vehicle theft.
- There were approximately 4.5 million filings in New York State trial courts in 2007.
- There were 63,536 inmates in state correctional facilities in November 2006. Over 95 percent of the inmates were men.
- Over 83 percent of all discrimination complaints filed in New York State in fiscal year 2007-08 were employment related.
- There were over 1.5 million fire department calls in New York State in 2006, including fires, rescue/EMS, and false alarms; about 97,000 of these calls were for fires.

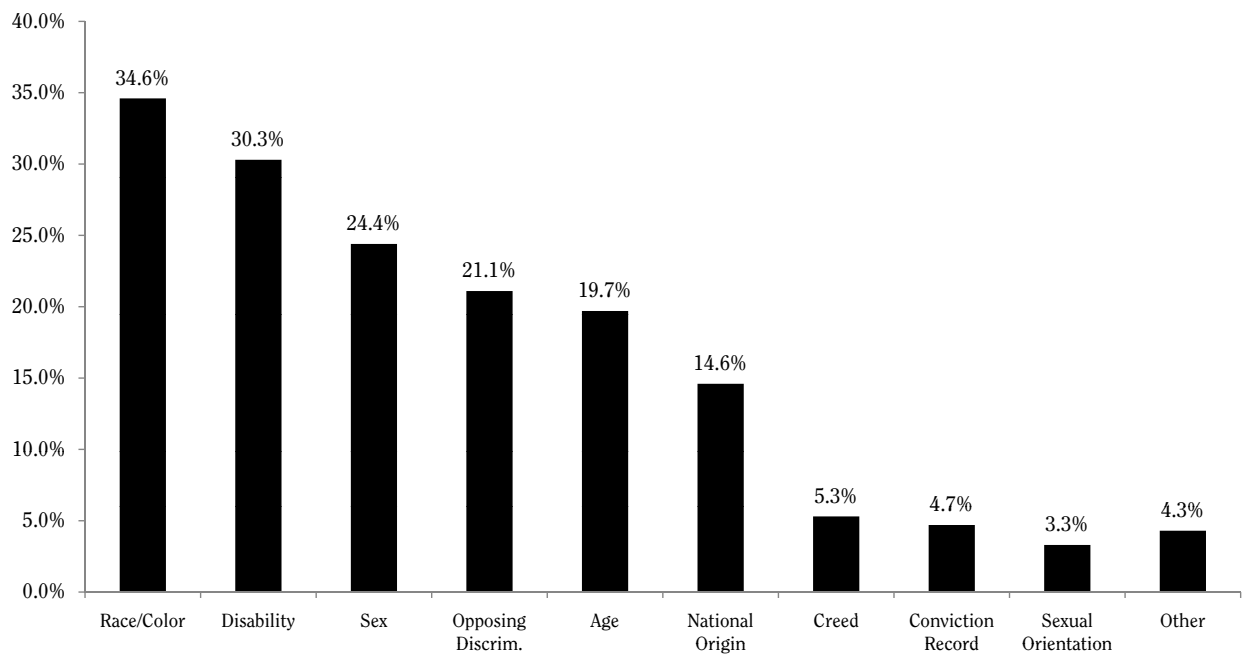

New York State — Fiscal Year 2007-08

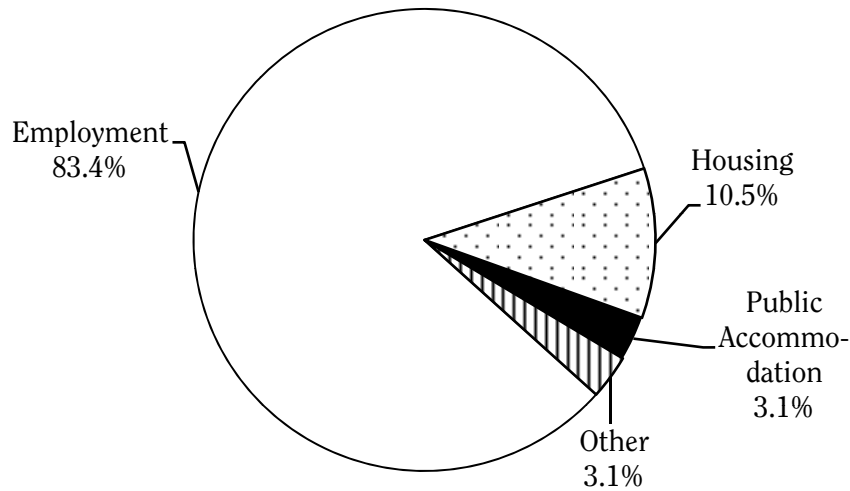
